Brentwood Enterprise Park emerging plans and public consultation

We have been made aware of a letter issued by St. Modwen's regarding their plans for a new employment park on land next to the M25 / A127 junction – known as Brentwood Enterprise Park – and to advise you of the upcoming public consultation.

Their letter states:

This consultation marks the start of an exciting phase of investment, delivery, and development at a site that is allocated for employment in Brentwood Council's emerging Local Plan and central to the council's strategy for jobs growth and supporting a successful local economy.

Local benefits

Brentwood Enterprise Park has the potential to make a positive impact throughout the borough by:

• Bringing significant investment into Brentwood, attracting major businesses to the area, and providing opportunities for existing local businesses to prosper and grow

• Creating around 2,000 jobs for local people, which could be worth approximately £40 million per year to Brentwood's economy

• Delivering infrastructure funding and contributions in the region of £15 million

• Generating business rates payments for Brentwood Council of some £2.5 million per year

• Providing a range of benefits for the community, including access to on-site amenities and improvements to local roads, footpaths and cycleways We are in the early stages of preparing a planning application for the site and we aim to submit this to

the Council later this year.

Our public consultation

St. Modwen is committed to building a long-term relationship with communities and consulting local people on our developments. We are launching this consultation to present our emerging proposals for

Brentwood Enterprise Park, give the local community an early opportunity to comment on the work we are doing, and use this to help shape our final plans.

End of letter

We understand letters have been sent out to neighbours, businesses and local groups to make them aware of the consultation, which runs from Monday 2 August to Sunday 22 August 2021. Please ensure you have your say about this development which will have an enormous impact on our village. Our immediate concerns are the impact on Church Lane and Great Warley Street plus questions as to why a roundabout is needed on the link road to Codham Hall Farm: is there something else planned? Plus the increased traffic and total lack of 7.5 ton weight limit enforcement by Essex Police on both Warley Road and Great Warley Street.

VILLAGE NEWS

Good and bad news at Warley Place

The good news is that the Ellen Willmott roses which were planted two or three years ago around the rose arbour on the main lawn where she used to grow them have all flowered really well for the first time (See photo). These seven roses were either her particular favourites or were propagated by her or were named after her.

We are now able to welcome all of the volunteers back to Warley Place, either on Monday or on Wednesday mornings. There has been much less vandalism and litter on the reserve since the lockdowns have ended.

The bad/sad news is that both the conservatory and the old cloakroom have now had to be fenced off for safety reasons. The back wall of the cloakroom has been found to be unstable, and some concrete has fallen off the walls of the conservatory.

There will be no cattle on the reserve this year, because the fencing of the east and west meadows needs to be replaced. The meadows will be mown later in the year.

Five Acre Field

As mentioned in the last Issue, the Committal Hearing in the High Court scheduled for 9 March (for alleged breaches of the Injunction)

was adjourned by the judge to 21 April due to legal issues raised by the defendants. Further adjournments were made by the judge to hearings re-scheduled for 19 May and 8 June respectively, following similar requests made by the occupants of Five Acre Field. The hearing has now been scheduled for three days **11-13 October.**

A provisional date for the Public Inquiry into the Planning Application Appeal has now been set for **1 February 2022** and will last 8-10 days.

LOWER THAMES CROSSING

Lower Thames Crossing

Anyone who regularly travels from Essex to Kent will be aware it can take anything from thirty minutes to three hours to make the journey via the Dartford Crossing, be it by bridge or tunnels. The crossing is running at more than 100% capacity and while it eased off somewhat over lockdown, traffic is now back to full frustrating tailback status.

Next week the next stage of the consultation into the Lower Thames Crossing (LTC) begins as it prepares to submit its application for a Development Consent Order later this year. The proposed crossing will almost double road capacity between Kent, Thurrock, Havering and Essex, and ease congestion and improve air quality on the Dartford Crossing by diverting over 13 million vehicles away every year. If approved, the LTC will skirt round the edge of the Brentwood and Ongar constituency, bring traffic direct from Kent through two new tunnels under the Thames and joining the M25 just south of Junction 29. However, in the Southernmost corner of the Brentwood and Ongar constituency, where the border is defined by the M25 and just south of the A127, lies Hole Farm.

Farmed by the same family for the last fifty years, Hole Farm was recently put up for sale and has been bought by Highways England to create habitats for wildlife and a green space for community use next to the new Lower Thames Crossing.

I visited the farm recently with Matt Palmer, the Executive Director for Lower Thames Crossing, and Emily Dawson, the project's Head of Benefits. Currently fields of wheat are turning golden in the occasional July sun, but once this crop is harvested no more wheat will be grown here. Instead, the 250 acre site will become a new community woodland managed by Forestry England. Native trees will be planted, including a community orchard, and there are hopes of a café, heritage centre and education centre too. Matt and Emily assured me this will all go ahead whether the LTC gets planning permission or not, so the constituency will benefit from a new habitat for animals – dormice are high up on the agenda for encouragement – and a beautiful community asset too. I look forward to seeing how it develops over the next few years.
