
Platinum Jubilee Village Tea Party Thursday 2nd June

The Spring Bulb Spectacular weekends were a great success this year. The East and West meadows are about to have new fencing so that cows can be brought in to graze the grass low enough for next year's daffodil show. The footpath through the East meadow, next to the South pond, will have a fence beside it so that cows will not be able to access the visitors.

'Miss Willmott's Ghosts' by Sandra Lawrence


This excellent book about Ellen Willmott, the last resident owner of Warley Place, became available on Thursday 5 May. A book launch was held at Waterstones in Brentwood, where Sandra Lawrence was interviewed by a friend. She described how she researched the material for the book, before answering questions from the audience and signing their copies. All the tickets for this popular event had been sold in advance.

When Ellen Willmott died in 1934, her papers, letters, photographs and other archives were all removed to Spetchley Park near Worcester, the estate belonging to her nephew Robert Berkeley and his family. The boxes and trunks full of material remained there, untouched and deteriorating, until John Cannell and other volunteers attached to Warley Place started to sort through them. Access was not easy, but John managed to copy many interesting documents and photographs. He later improved the photos on his computer, several of

them being displayed at Warley Place today, and, with the help of his colleagues, transcribed the handwritten documents

Sandra Lawrence had access to John's material, and she then started to do her own even more extensive research, often in very difficult conditions. Many documents had turned to dust or were only partly readable, but John and the other volunteers helped Sandra to transcribe those that survived. The archives had by then been moved to Berkeley Castle in Gloucestershire, the ancestral home of the Berkeley family. The archivist there was a great help to Sandra, and several surprises about Ellen Willmott were revealed through the huge numbers of letters which she had received.

Sandra has spent several years immersed in researching and writing this book, and the result gives a fascinating insight into the life of this amazing gardener who was once so much a part of Great Warley.



Forest England Hole Farm Proposals

A steering group from the Conservation Society recently met with the team handling this project and there was a useful discussion covering concerns including traffic generation, access and egress; car park locations + free or charged use; possible peak use parking overflow; user facilities; accessibility for walkers, horse riders, cyclists; landscaping aesthetics (ie will the trees be in scruffy plantations a la Folkes Lane, Pike Lane etc); long term management; agricultural maintenance equipment storage & access locations; site security; vistas ie maintaining distant views from the De Rougement Cricket Club.

The team are proposing an evening presentation to our GWCS members and local residents. We are waiting confirmation that this will either be on 9th or 14th June at the Rectory Hall commencing at around 5.30/6pm. We will advise members asap.

It has been confirmed that, as Forest England has bought Hole Farm, the project will go ahead regardless of any future decisions taken on the Lower Thames Crossing road projects.

The Lower Thames Crossing Project has now moved to consulting on some localised changes before they submit their Development Consent Order application. If you want to find out more go to https://
