Blue Plaque for Ellen Willmott

On Friday 19th August, exactly 164 years after the birth of Ellen Willmott, the Lord Lieutenant of Essex, Mrs Jennifer Tolhurst, came to Warley Place to unveil a blue plaque in honour of Miss Willmott. The plaque was supplied by the Essex Gardens Trust.

A reception was held outside the conservatory at Warley Place, with refreshments and a 164th birthday cake supplied by the Essex Gardens Trust. The speakers (I to r in the photo) were Sandra Lawrence, author of Miss Willmott's Ghosts; Jane Frederick, Essex Gardens Trust's Artist in Residence; Mick Hedges, Warden of Warley Place; Ailsa Wildig, leader of the Warley Place Research Group, and Carol White, organiser of this event.

The speakers stood beside the rose arbour which was re-erected a few years ago on its original flint base. The roses planted there were especially chosen because of their links with Ellen Willmott, including one which is named after her.

Ellen Willmott's plaque is one of several being unveiled in Essex to celebrate the achievements of women all over the county in all sorts of fields. The plaque will be attached to a wall in the walled garden, but it has not yet been put in place because of the building work which is going on at Warley Place at present. (More photos on page 2)

Great Warley Hut, later to become the Rectory Hall

Prior to the 1914-18 war, the Long Room above the coach house at Goldings Manor (now the de Rougemont Manor Hotel) was used for the Great Warley village social gatherings. It contained, among other furnishings, two full-sized billiard tables. In 1909, for example, the Long Room Club had 29 male members, and the Mothers Club had 18 members.

Heating and lighting in the winter were provided by Evelyn Heseltine and his family, who lived at Goldings. George Hearn stoked the stove, and down the road he also stoked the coal-fired generator (in Elm Lodge) which provided electricity to Goldings, the Church, and the Rectory. The Rectory is now Great Warley Place, across the road from the church. George's brother Billy organised late night 'hops' in the Long Room.

After the First World War the exterior staircase to the Long Room became unsafe. There followed a suggestion that a brick hall should be built up the hill near the centre of the village, to be called the Memorial Hall. Mr Heseltine, however, preferred the memorial to be a cross on the village green, which he provided.

The villagers therefore contributed to a fund for a wooden meeting place, and in the 1920s the Great Warley Hut was opened for all social activities on land across the road from the church. It was used by guides and brownies and for a youth club, among other organisations, and modern gas heating was installed there.

In 1949 the Women's Institute replaced gas lighting with electricity, and in 1988/89 Mrs Joan Boddam Whetham, a churchwarden with plenty of enthusiasm, organised a hot water supply, new kitchen equipment and carpeting for a total cost of £2000, most of which was donated.

Also at about this time grants were obtained from Brentwood District Council for toilet facilities costing £3000. Previously a toilet in the Rectory Lodge had been used if necessary. Ma-

terials and services were also provided by village residents and by the congregation. The Hut had become eligible for these grants because it was a village hall, and therefore it was renamed the Rectory Hall.

New furniture, crockery and cutlery were installed in 1992/93, and about five years ago the electric wiring was completely renewed and the hall was entirely redecorated by Rev. Rob Binks and Liz Francis, together with several others. New tables, chairs and cupboards were donated by the Essex Fire Service, which no longer had need of them. A second toilet was also created at this time.

We have a lovely little village Church - St. Mary the Virgin which has a friendly congregation meeting every Sunday for services usually at 11.30.

There are various clubs which you may like to try out. The ladies lunch club is very popular meeting every month and it's a great place to start if you'd like to meet other ladies who live locally.

There is a sewing group which meets every month and which you would be made most welcome at. It is said that sometimes not much sewing goes on, but we certainly put the world to rights over tea and cake! It's a great place to meet local ladies and although we call it a sewing group, bring any craft along. There is usually knitting, embroidering, crochet and quilting going on.

There are local WI (Women's Institute) groups in Brentwood Town and Little Warley. The Brentwood Belles is a large group with 120 members and a waiting list which meets at the South Weald Parish Hall every third Wednesday of the month at 8pm. The Great & Little Warley WI meet in the village hall at Little Warley every second Tuesday of the month at 2pm. There are U3A groups in Warley, Shenfield and Hutton which organise lots of visits and have fun evenings trying new things. These are very friendly groups who are always on the lookout for new members.

There is the Brentwood Theatre in the town which hosts some great shows from local Operatic societies and other performing groups. There are Operatic Societies in Brentwood, Shenfield and Billericay. Amateur dramatics is a really fun way to get to know other people.

The Brentwood Writers Circle meet every first Saturday of the month from 2-5pm in Brentwood Town Centre and have interesting speakers and organise fun events.

The Brentwood Role Play Society meets every Thursday with Games and Dungeon Masters overseeing Dungeons and Dragons and other sci-fi board games. They meet every Thursday evening from 7pm in Central Brentwood.

There are several tennis, cricket and golf clubs around the town all within easy reach of the village.
