De Rougemont Hotel Planning permission granted for conversion and new build

Despite substantial opposition (and contrary to its own Development Plan), Brentwood Council granted consent for 43 houses and 11 apartments in the Conservation Area and Green Belt at last week's planning committee meeting.

Several Councillors argued against it (but then abstained, causing the application to gain consent).

The Conservation Society's planning expert, Phil Barrett, voiced opposition against building in the car park but in vain.

Planning and Enforcement Appeals at Five Acre Field

As you may already be aware, a public inquiry into the development of Five Acre Field was held on 10-13 and 17-19 January 2023 as a result of an appeal having being made against an enforcement notice and a refusal to grant planning permission by Brentwood Borough Council.

A decision was made in favour of the Council by the Inspector on 7 February by dismissing the appeals, upholding the enforcement notices and refusing the planning permission. The appellants have been given 12 months to comply with these decisions.

In his summary, the Inspector found that the site amounted to "inappropriate development in the green belt" regarding the site being situated in a "particularly sensitive green belt location" with further harm to openness and the countryside. The site was considered fundamentally unsuited for development which was also considered a "textbook example of intentional unauthorised development."

The Society was represented by its own barrister who worked in parallel with the Council's barrister. After three years of hard work by the Great Warley Conservation Society the result is a positive one for Great Warley and the local environment.

Thanks are due to all those who supported the case both financially and otherwise.

EILEEN NEWBY RIP

Eileen Newby RIP

With the sad passing of Eileen Newby an era comes to an end as Ken and Eileen were residents at 3 Bird Lane for close to 75 years. They moved in to no 3 as recent newlyweds when the house was still brand new and they went about making it into what turned out to be their forever home.

Ken set about getting the garden laid out for producing fresh fruit and vegetables with a chicken run at the bottom for fresh eggs. Linda was then born in 1951 but sadly passed away in 2022.

During harvest at Codham Hall in 1952 there was major excitement when the combine Ken was operating caught fire (then farmed by the Goodchild family). Quick thinking by Ken kept the damage to a minimum, not all super heroes wear capes!

In 1954 their son Graham was born and the family was complete. Graham has now retired and

lives in Australia with his wife. They have a son and grandchildren.

Both Newby children attended the School in Bird Lane (School House) where Eileen was the dinner lady and Ken maintained the playing fields with his Suffolk cut mower.

Eileen went on to become house keeper for the Ellingworth, Goodchild and Padfield family (the latter right up until her 70's when she used to ride her bike to Codham Hall every day.)

Eileen and Ken have two grandsons (one in the UK and one in Australia) and 5 grandchildren who sadly never met Ken and Eileen.

Ken's level hedge outside no 3 is legendary as he managed it all by hand and eye, and now sadly not the case since his passing in 2020. So what next for 3 Bird Lane? What we do know is that Ken and Eileen's DNA will be forever etched in local folklore.
