Warley Place Spring Bulb Spectacular weekends

The daffodil season at Warley Place attracted large numbers of visitors, especially at weekends. A total of £6000 was raised at these weekends, with many more donations from weekday visitors, and we are most grateful for all of this money.

The building work is now finished apart from the Conservatory. We hope that this can be done soon, so that visitors can once again stand inside the shell of the house and experience the layout of the various ground floor rooms, as well as seeing the basement kitchen and scullery.

We are grateful to all of the volunteers who turn up on Monday and Wednesday mornings to maintain Warley Place, and to all who helped on the spring weekends. We are also grateful to Brentwood Cricket Club for the use of their car park as an overflow space. This was particularly useful on Mothering Sunday, when 547 visitors were recorded.

Great Warley Conservation Society update

The formal thanks and dedication of the trees by Chairman Alderman David Tee, took place on Friday of the Coronation weekend. Fiona and Michael unveiled their plaques and were delighted and felt honoured by this gesture of thanks and recognition.

The role of the Trustees is to protect and enhance the ancient legacy of Headley Common, so we trust the trees will thrive and add beauty and colour as well as recognising Fiona's and Michael's voluntary services.

Brief History of Headley Common

Today Headley Common is managed by a charitable Trust.

Headley Common was part of Warley Common that stretched eastwards from Great Warley parish through the parishes of Little Warley and Childerditch all the way to Thorndon Hall in Ingrave. In the 10th Century Warley Common was owned by the very wealthy Barking Abbey and it is significant that the Abbess of Barking retained ownership of the Manor of Great Warley, then known as Warley Magna, after the Norman Conquest in 1066. The Manor was in their ownership for more than 600 years and only ceased with the suppression of religious houses by Henry the Eighth, when on 8th November 1539 the Abbess of Barking signed the deed of surrender.

The Great Warley Manor was held by many different families in the 16th Century until 1700 when it was held by Mark Wynn and in 1763 it passed to his cousin, The Honourable George Winn who was created a Baronet in 1776 and became the first Lord Headley in 1797. It was then that the inn on the Common changed its name from "The Magpie" to the "Headley Arms". Also, from that time this part of Great Warley Common gradually assumed the name that it has today, Headley Common. The Winn family and their successors held the Manor of Great Warley until the large Warley Lodge Estate was sold in July 1919.

In 1771 the Hirst family built Great Ropers just to the west of Headley Common and sometime after Waterloo (1815) they purchased the Great Warley Poor House that stood on Headley Common near to the house called the Croft. In 1900 Robert Hirst moved his fence back along Warley Road to widen the path so his daughters might ride their ponies.

In 1919 the Hirst family bought an interest in the Headley Arms and the Great Warley Manorial rights of the Common when the Warley Lodge Estate was sold in July 1919. The same year one of the daughters, Emma, planted an Oak tree on the Common to give thanks for the termination of hostilities in 1918. Emma's nephew, Major Hirst, sold Great Ropers after the next war in 1946 by which time the Manorial rights of Great Warley had been given to Brentwood District Council. However, on 2nd December 1949 the Trustees of the Warley Estate who felt they held the Lord of the Manor of Great Warley purported to convey some 5 acres of Headley Common to Mann Crossman & Paulin Ltd. who held the freehold of The Headley Arms Inn. Their successors, Watney Mann & Truman Holdings Ltd. attempted to form a Charitable Trust to care for the Common. The Charity Commission challenged the ownership and deemed such a charity run by the brewery had a conflict of interest.

Early in 1981 Watney's London Ltd. accepted they had no right of ownership and the Charity Commission ruled that it was not appropriate for their company to be trustees of the Common.

On 21st October 1981 the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales approved and sealed a scheme called "The Headley Common Trust" for the maintenance and upkeep of the Common including the pond and a wooded area which all together measures 5.8 acres. The deed states that Headley Common is to be a place of recreation for the inhabitants of Great Warley and Shenfield and neighbouring population. The income to the Trust to come from a lease with the owners of The Headley Arms for the use of the car park in front of the Inn. Now of course the inn is the Felix Restaurant. There are eight Trustees and they are appointed for four-year terms. Four by Brentwood Borough Council and four by the Great Warley Conservation Society. The good folk of Great Warley still have a say.
